Participation in the EZLN Army the Sociopolitical ...

focus on women's rights, and its expression of this priority through the Revolutionary Law of Women, made the EZLN distinct from other rural social movements; previous movements had welcomed female guerilla participation, but did not focus on alleviating the grievances of indigenous women
